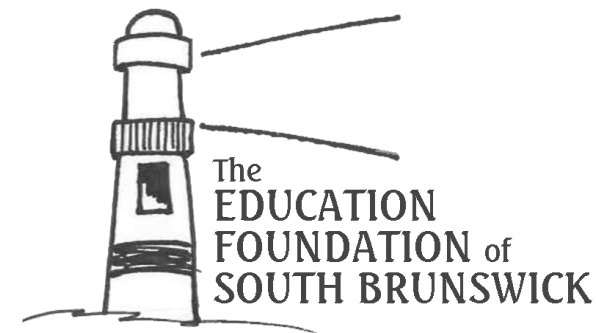

Grant Program

began its Spark of Innovation grant program in the spring of 2011 and to date, the Education Foundation of South Brunswick Township, Inc. has provided nearly \$83,000 in Mini and Collaborative grants to teachers in the South Brunswick School District.

Physical Education Grants

Since 2014, through its Tour de South Brunswick and Foundation Fun Walk fundraising events, the Foundation has granted \$6,600 to the physical education programs at various schools in the South Brunswick School District.

Scholarships

Since June 2011, the Foundation has committed \$52,500 in scholarships to South Brunswick High School graduating seniors. The Foundation awards up to 3 scholarships per year to graduating South Brunswick H.S. seniors. The value of each scholarship is \$2500 over 4 years (1000/500/500/500). Funding for these scholarships comes from a direct donation from Chartwells, Dr. Gary P. McCartney and others. For applications and requirements please contact the high school guidance office.

Capital Project

The Foundation has made grants totaling over \$41,000 to fund the Viking Television Network (VTN) Studio Makeover. VTN provides video services for the South Brunswick High School and the entire school district.
